

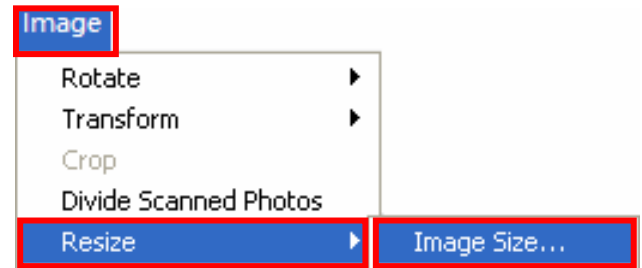
# TIPS TRICKS AND HOW TO...

## Adjust the Size and Resolution of Your Images

Sizing your pictures in Elements is an easy process.

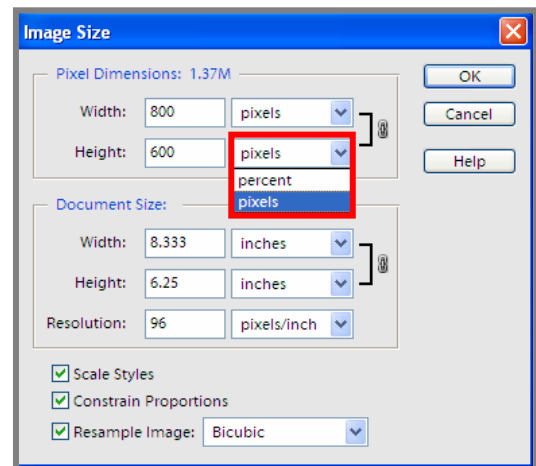
From the “Image” menu choose “Resize” and then select “Image Size.”

You can size your photos using a few different methods in Elements.



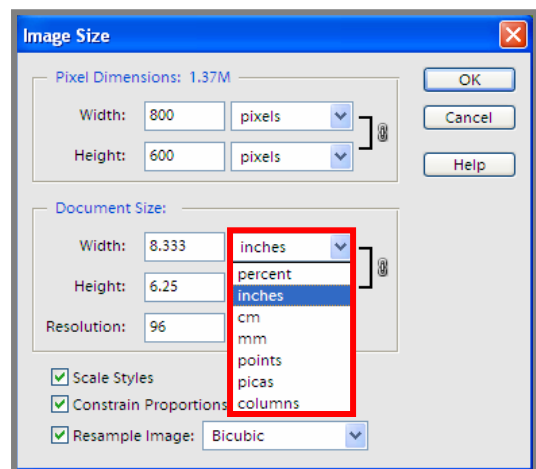
### Pixel Dimensions

The first method for sizing your photographs is to use pixel dimensions. You can set your pixel dimensions by actual pixels going the width and height of your image or scale your image by pixel percentage. Both options are available under the pixel dimensions drop menu.



### Document Size

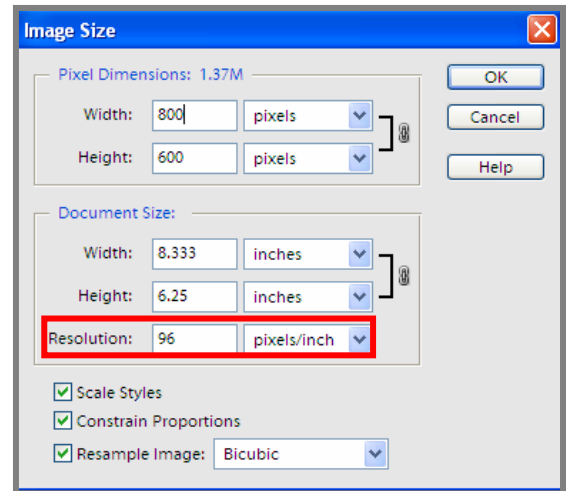
Document size allows you to set the width and height of your photograph using inches, cm, mm, points, picas, or columns.



## Resolution

You can adjust your photograph's resolution for print or web access through the image size dialog box.

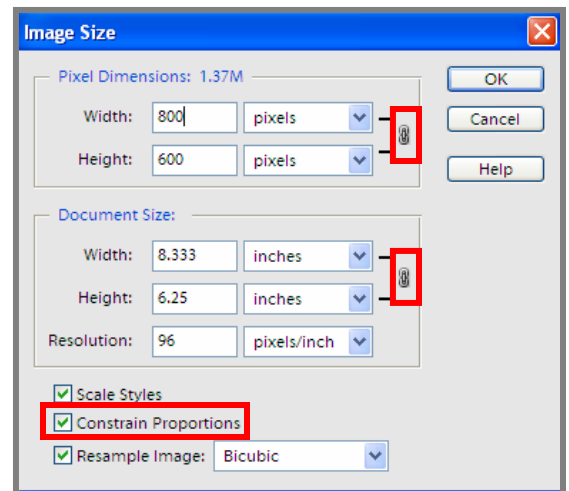
Adjust your image to 72 dpi for web access and 300 dpi for printing.



## Constrain Proportions

With this option selected, your images are scaled so that they still maintain their proper height and width proportions. If this option is unchecked, you are allowed to disproportion and stretch your image.

The "link" icon next to the sizing options lets you know that the constrain proportions option is selected.



When you have made your sizing choices, select OK to apply them to your document.
